Now entering its 15th year, Leadership In Action is an eight week summer program that is designed to develop emerging leaders by providing college students with opportunities to gain a hands-on meaningful experience working in Asian and Pacific Islander community-based organizations in Southern California.

CBO ELIGIBILITY

- Nonprofit organization serving the API community with an office located in the greater Los Angeles or Orange County area
- One full-time staff person who will fulfill all responsibilities associated with being the intern's supervisor
- Complete and submit the application and work plan by February 22, 2012.

As a placement organization, each agency is assigned one intern who works on an assigned project four days per week for the duration of the eight-week program. The agency will ensure the quality of the interns experience and create a work plan for the summer that should include planning and implementation. Each intern will receive a \$2500 stipend.

APPLICATIONS ARE DUE ON FEBRUARY 22, 2012.
